I have been on 10+ African safaris and was given special hunt with local jackel hunter with state of the art hunting chair platform on pickup truck. I harvested six jackel in two nites with electric and hand calls with low to high lights, but no cats

2. Personal highlights: Allow to hunt at nite on Rhino lodge concession 30,000 acres with 2 P.H.'s + herds of animals, all open grassland, P.H. Steve family made leather items, gave me as a gift an animal wild skin rug.
