1. Did you encounter any problems? The hunting concession was two miles outside of Kruger National Park. It was about 1200 acres of heavy bush that you could only see 20 to 40 yards at a time. 10 to 20 animal herds of buffalo would take off at 100 yards if they heard or saw you. 5 other hunters had taken 5 poor quality buffalo, 36 inches or less, making the herd hard to hunt. I took a 44+ inch buffalo on the 3rd day after trackers followed the herd and pushed one trophy buffalo out to 100 yards from me.

2. Personal highlights: P.H. Steve took me to Kruger National Park one day, he has camped in the park for many years and knows it better than tour guides.

3. Comments on performance of guide: P.H. Robbie Jacombs Imbabala Safari also works for the fish and wildlife service of Kruger National Park. He captures many excess and problem animals from the park and transfers them to open hunting areas. He knows where the big 5 are.
